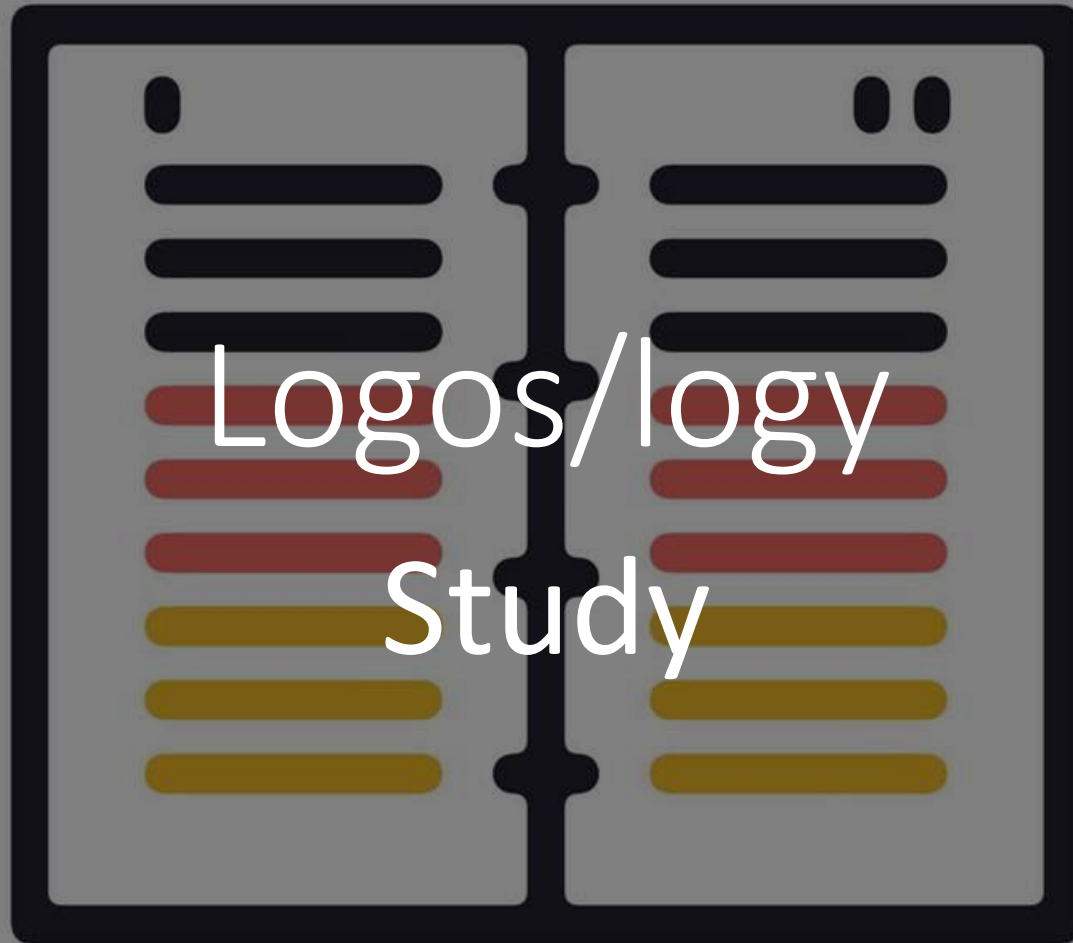

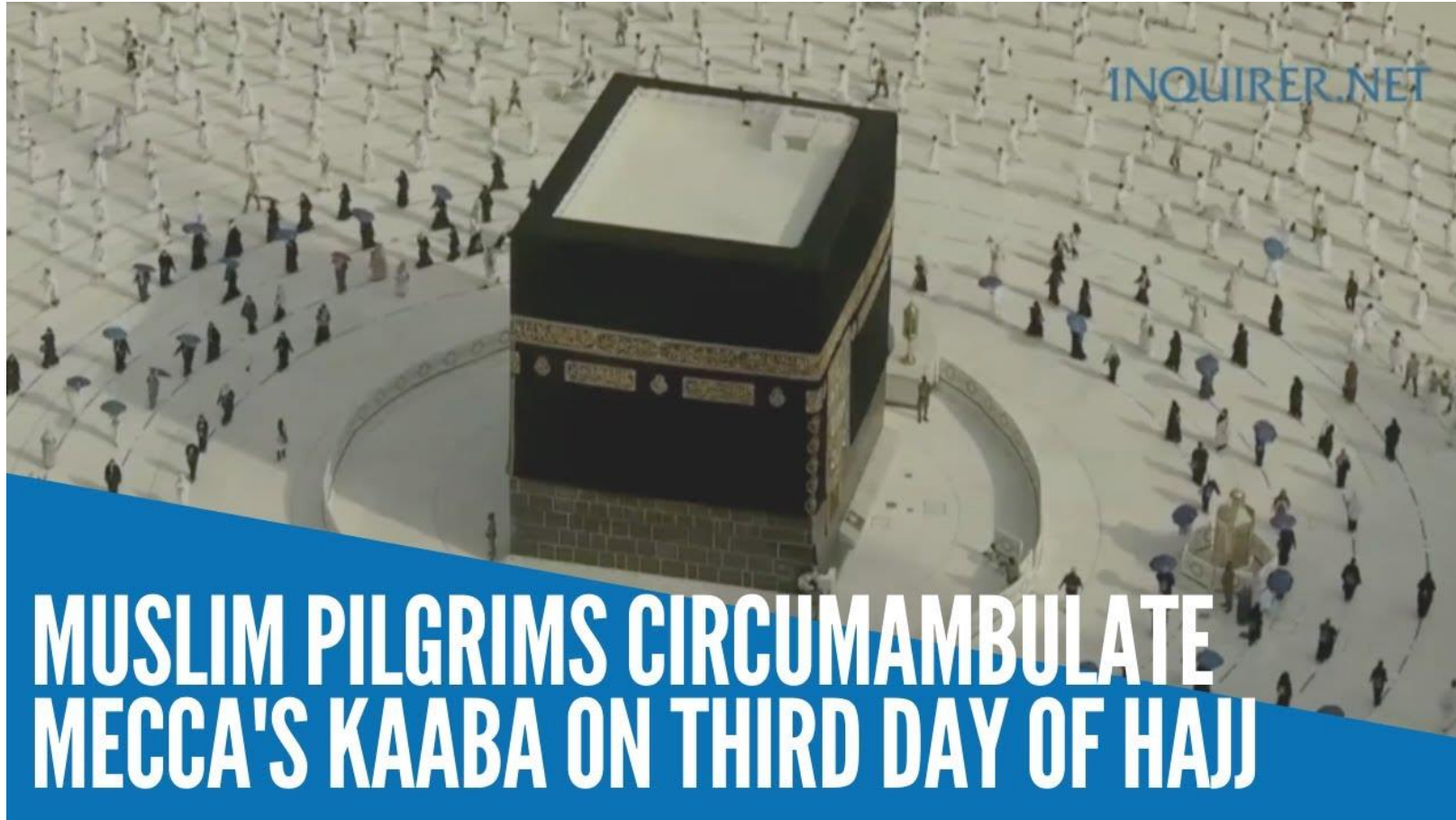


Ambul- to Walk

Funambulist

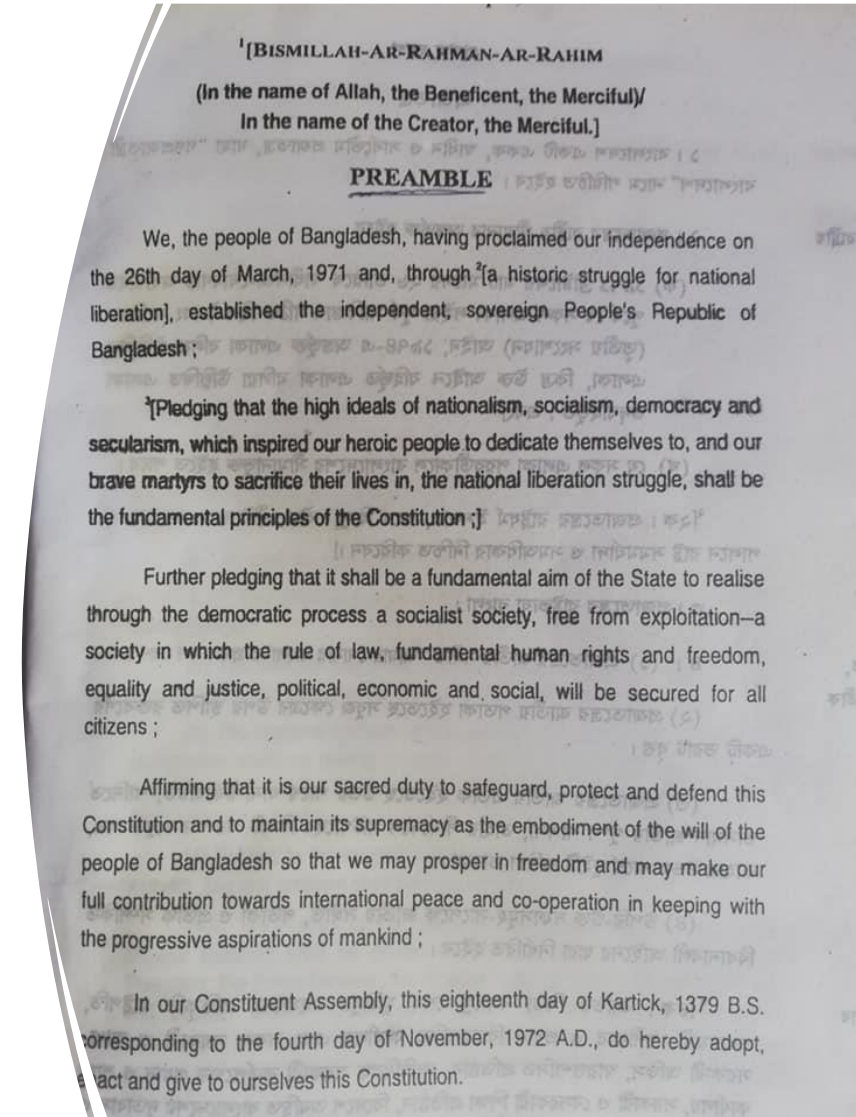
A tightrope walking

Panhuman:

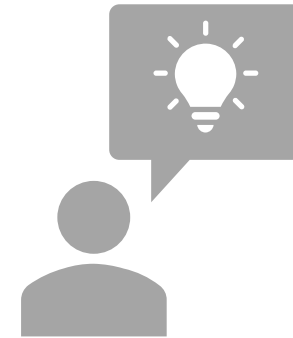
Relating to all

A combination of telescope and microscope

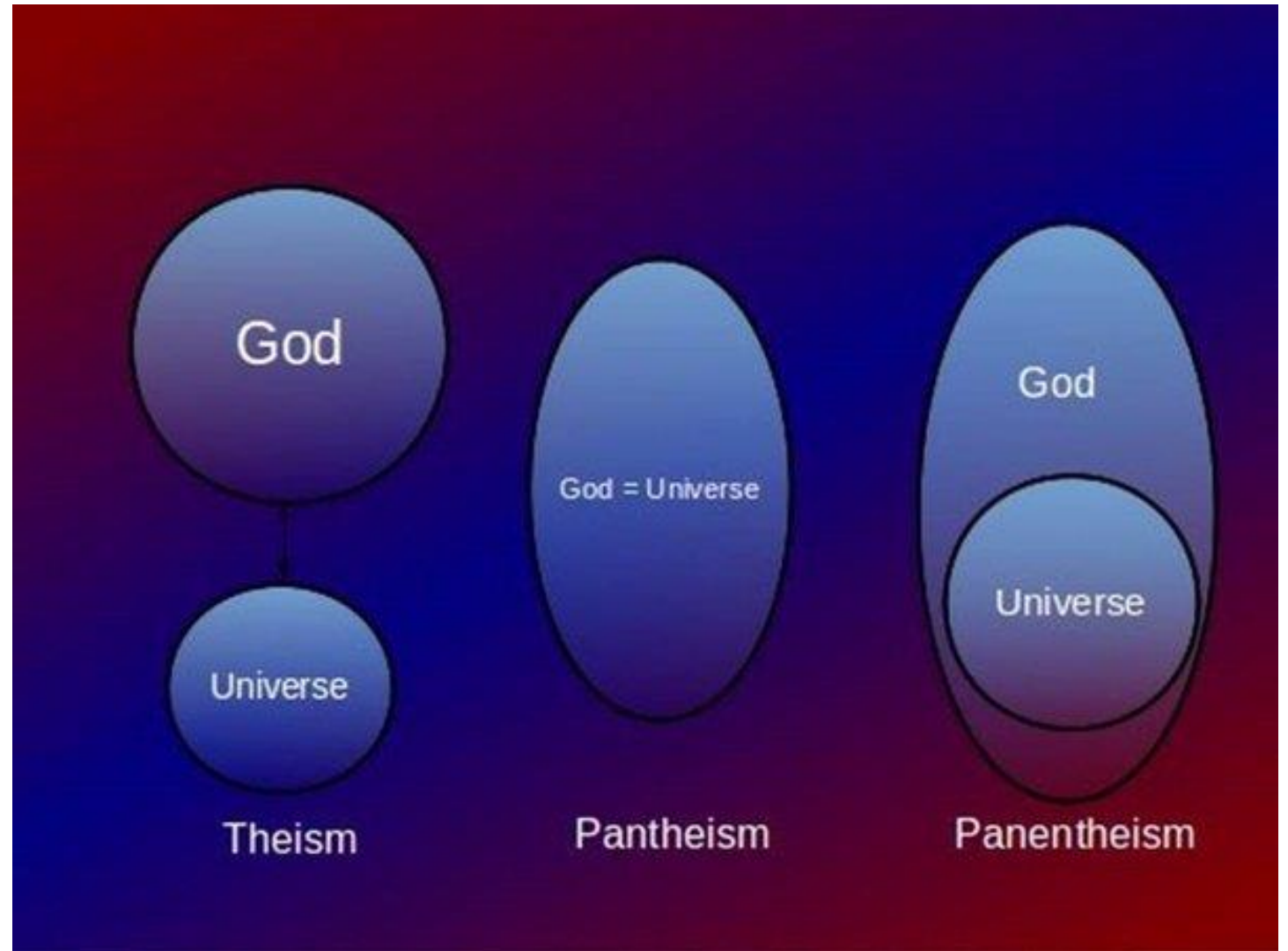

rule

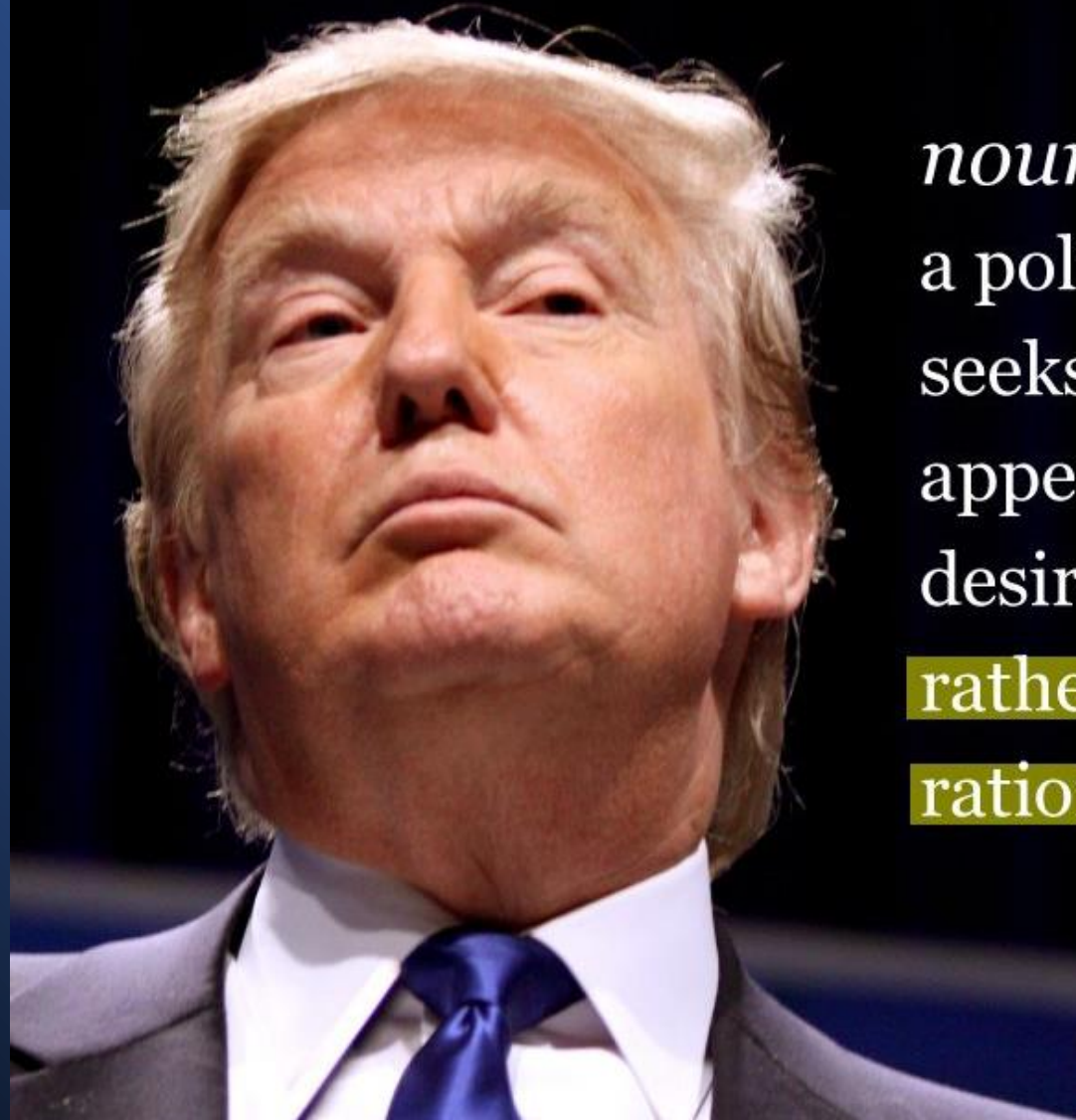
dem·a·gogue:

Demoeconomy

Demography

- Branch of sociology that deals with statistics of populations (for example: that is births, deaths, marriages)

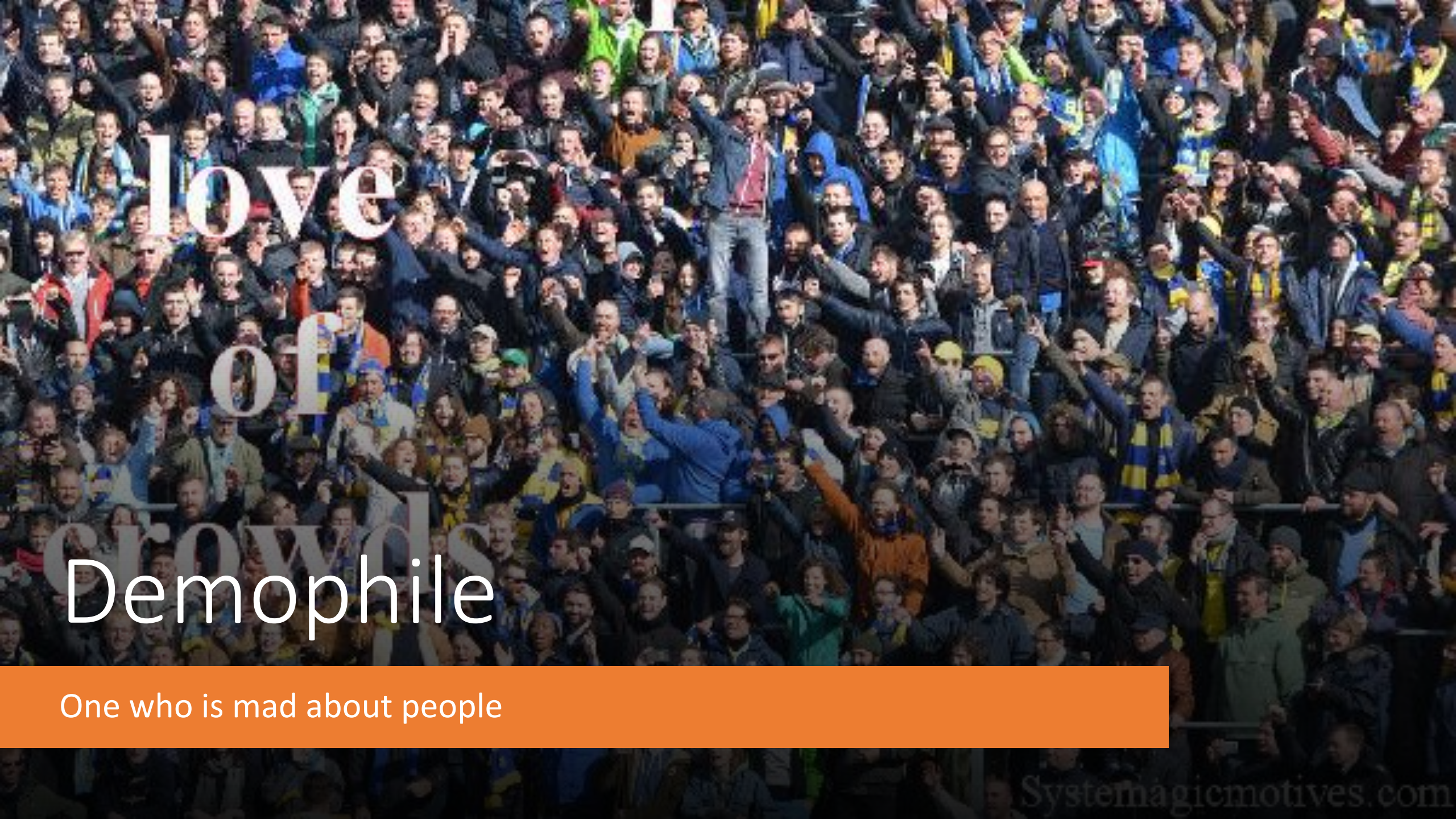
Demonym

love of crowds

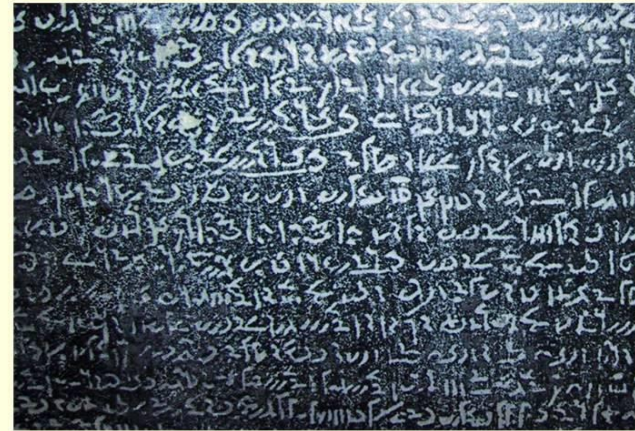
Demophile

Demotic (Egyptian)

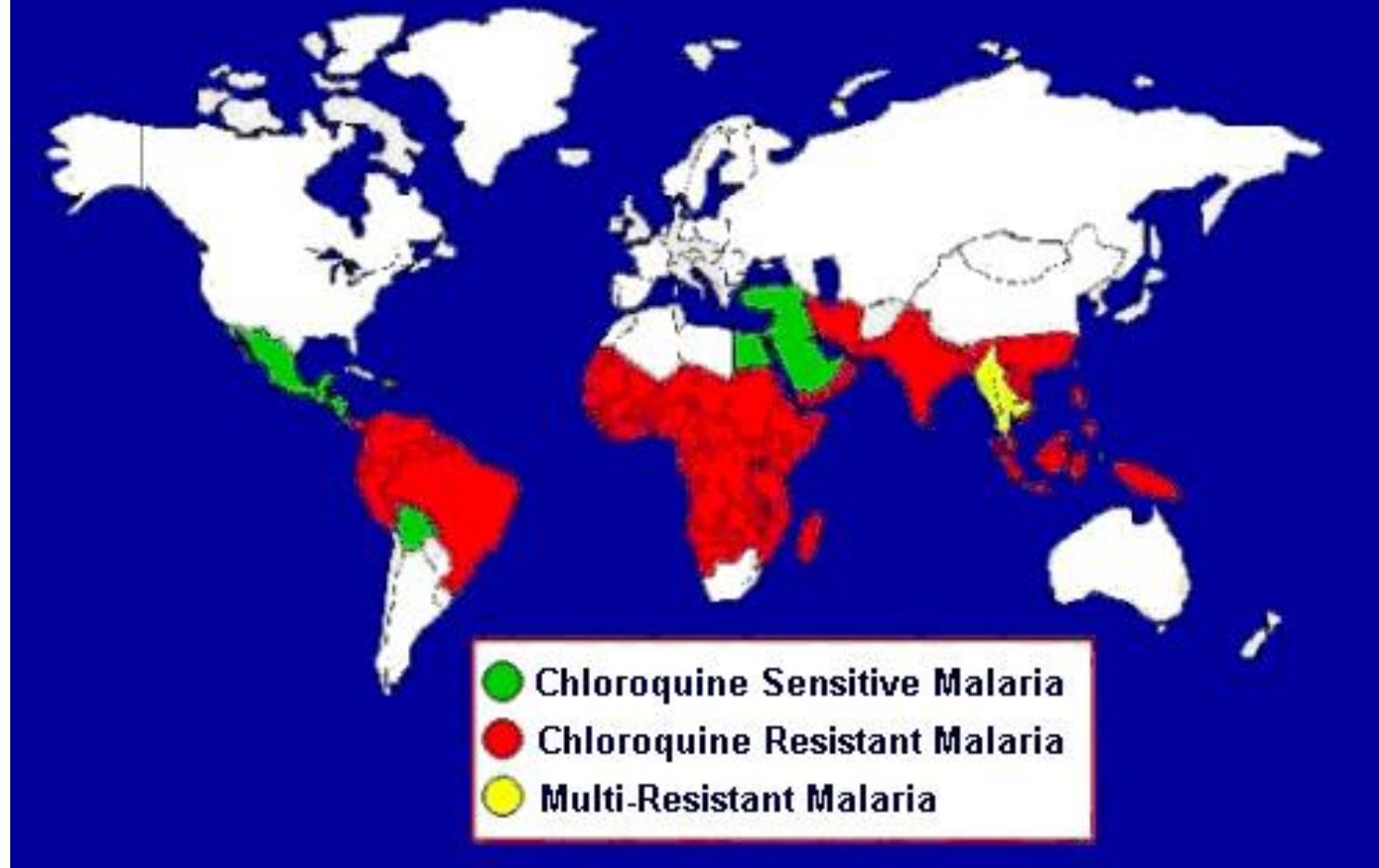

Colloquial

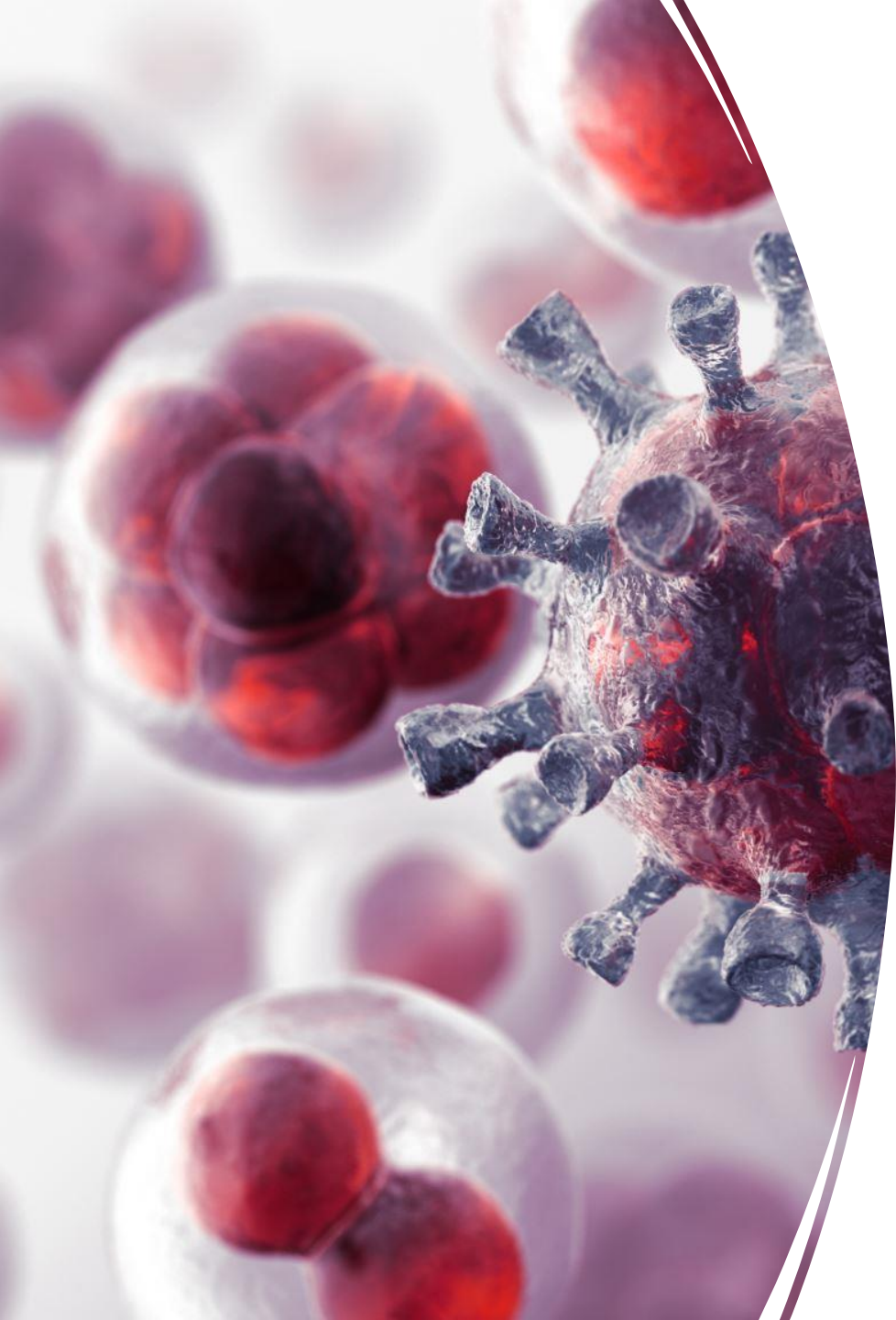
- It is used in casual settings with friends, family or familiar people.
- Some examples of colloquialisms include "gonna" instead of "going to", "wanna" instead of "want to", and "awesome" instead of "very good".
- Using colloquial language can make your speech or writing sound more friendly and approachable. However, it is important to be aware of the context and to avoid using colloquialisms in formal settings.

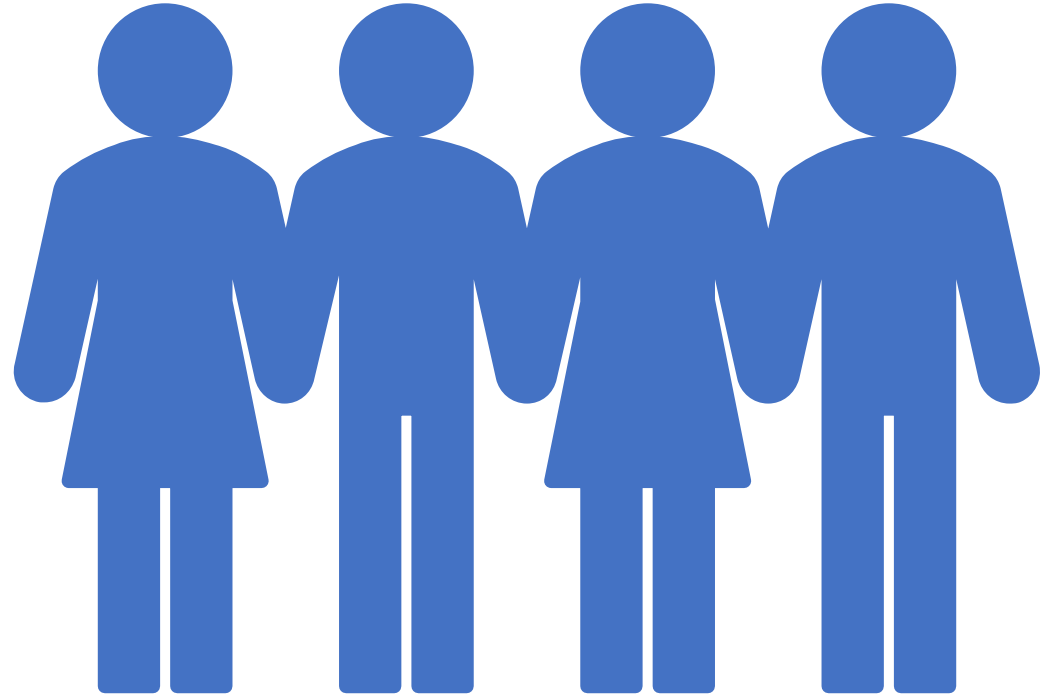


Epidemic (Epi=Upon)
