system of secret writing/coding

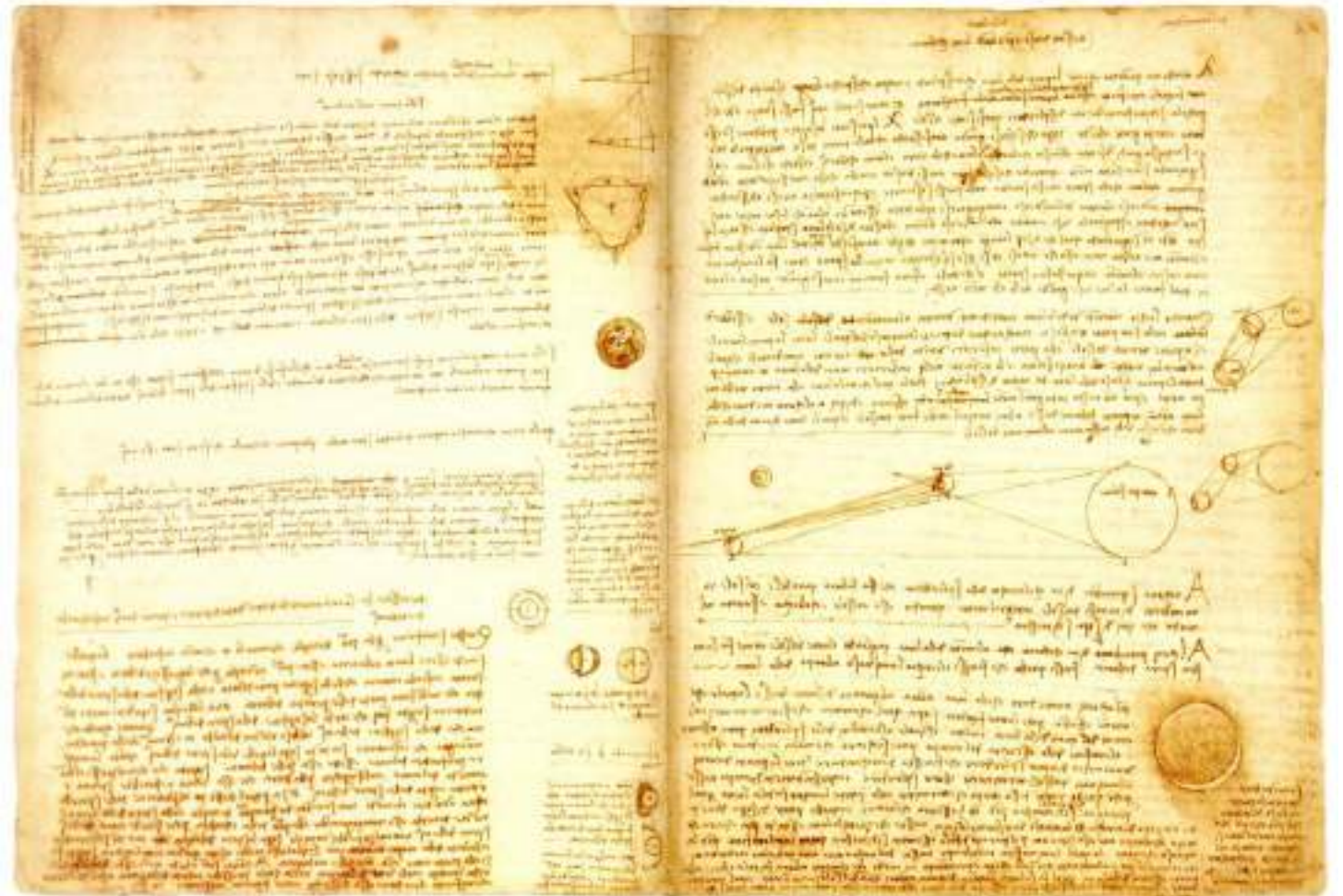
Seismograph

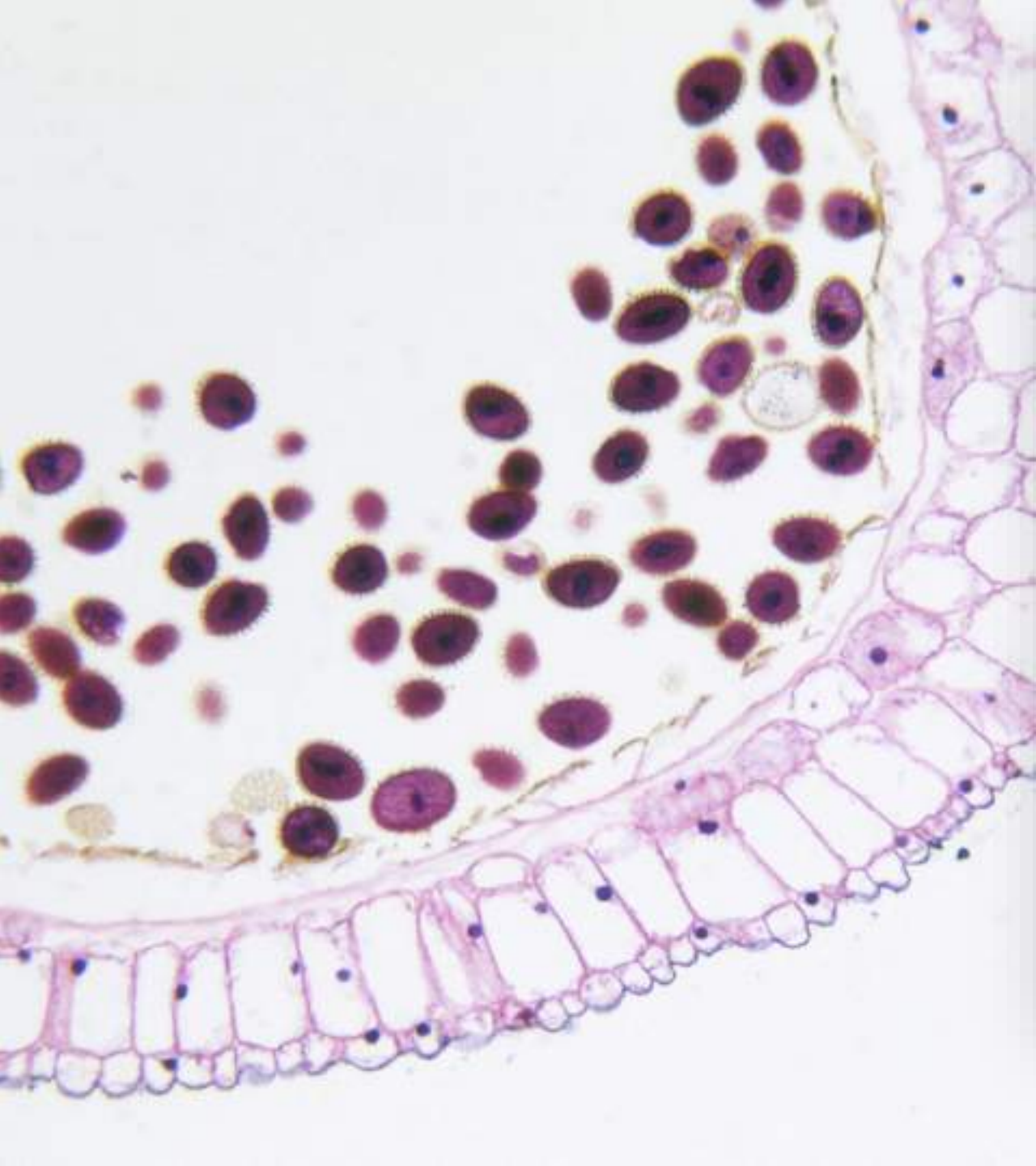
