NARRATION

RULE #1

Direct: Emma said to me, "I will go home now."

Direct: “Will you play football tomorrow?” I asked Atif.

Indirect: I asked Atif if he would play football the next day.

RULE #2

Direct: - - - - - + Reported Speech + Reported Speech + - -

Assertive Sentence এর ক্ষেত্রে

also said/ again said**

**Interrogative Sentence এর

EXAMPLE

Direct: - - - - - + Reported Speech + Reported Speech + - -

Direct: The teacher said to me, "You can stop reading. You may read tomorrow."

Direct: The teacher said to me,
“You can stop reading now. You
may read tomorrow.”

Indirect: The teacher told me
that I could stop reading then.
She added that I might read
the next day.

RULE #3

Reported Speech শুধু  থাকলে,

Indirect: Subject + replied in the affirmative.

Or,

Subject + do/ does/ did/ was/ were/ has/ have/ had.

EXAMPLE

Indirect: Subject + replied in the affirmative.

Or,

Subject + do/ does/ did/ was/ were/ has/ have/ had.

Direct: Arik said to me, "Have you done your task?".

I said, "Yes."

Direct: Arik said to me, "Have you done your task?". I said, "Yes".

Indirect: Arik asked me if I had done my task. I replied in the affirmative.

Or,

Indirect: Arik asked me if I had done my task. I said that I had.



**Reported Speech এ Yes এর পর কোন
বক্তব্য থাকলে,**

**Indirect: Subject + replied in the affirmative
+ and said that.**

EXAMPLE

Indirect: Subject + replied in the affirmative + and said that.

Direct: Arik said to Atif, "Have you finished your home work?" "Yes, I will submit it tomorrow.", said Atif.

Direct: Arik said to Atif, "Have you finished your homework?"

"Yes, I will submit it tomorrow", said Atif.

Indirect: Arik asked Atif if he (Atif) had finished his homework. Atif replied in the affirmative and said that he would submit that the next day.



Reported Speech শুধু **No থাকলে,**

Indirect: Subject + replied in the negative.

Or,

Subject + Auxiliary Verb + not.

EXAMPLE

Indirect: Subject + replied in the negative.

Or,

Subject + Auxiliary Verb + not.

Direct: Afrin said to Fateha, "Are you studying now?" Fateha said, "No."

Direct: Afrin said to Fateha, “Are you studying now?” Fateha said, “No.”

Indirect: Afrin asked Fateha if she (F) was studying then. Fateha replied in the negative.

Or, Indirect: Afrin asked Fateha if she (F) was studying then. Fateha replied that she was not.



**Reported Speech এ No এর পর কোন
বক্তব্য থাকলে,**

**Indirect: Subject + replied in the negative +
and said that.**

EXAMPLE

Indirect: Subject + replied in the negative + and said that.

Direct: Afifa said to Papia, "Are you coming my home tomorrow?"

"No, I have changed my decision.", said Papia.

**Direct: Afifa said to Papia, “Are you coming to my office tomorrow?”
“No, I have changed my decision.”,
said Papia.**

**Indirect: Afifa asked Papia if she (P)
was coming to her(A) office the next
day. Papia replied in the negative and
said that she (P) had changed her
decision.**

RULE #4

Direct Speech এ 'Sir' থাকলে

Indirect: Addressing as Sir

Or,

Sir এর পরিবর্তে Respectfully

EXAMPLE

Indirect: Addressing as Sir

Or,

Sir এর পরিবর্তে Respectfully

Direct: The student said to his teacher,

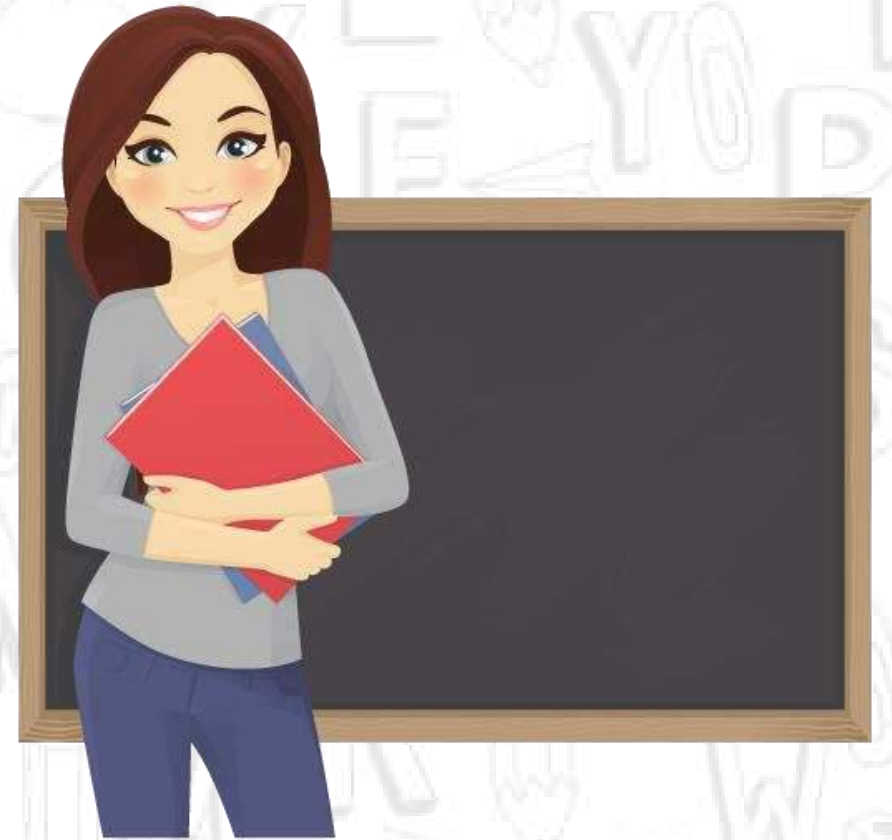
“Sir, I need the answer sheets.”

**Direct: The student said to teacher,
“Sir, I need one day leave.”**

**Indirect: The student told the
teacher respectfully that he needed
the answer sheets.**

Or,

**Indirect: Addressing the teacher
as Sir, the student said that he
needed the answer sheets.**





RULE #5

**Reported Speech এ যদি কাউকে
সম্বোধন (Address) করা হয়,
Indirect: Addressing as + - - - -**

EXAMPLE

Indirect: Addressing as + - - - -

Direct: “Are you tired, friends?” said the Army chief.

Direct: “Are you tired, friends?” said the Army chief.

Indirect: Addressing them as friends, the army chief asked if they were tired.





RULE #6

**Direct Speech এ By Allah/ By Jove/ By
God/ By my life থাকলে,**

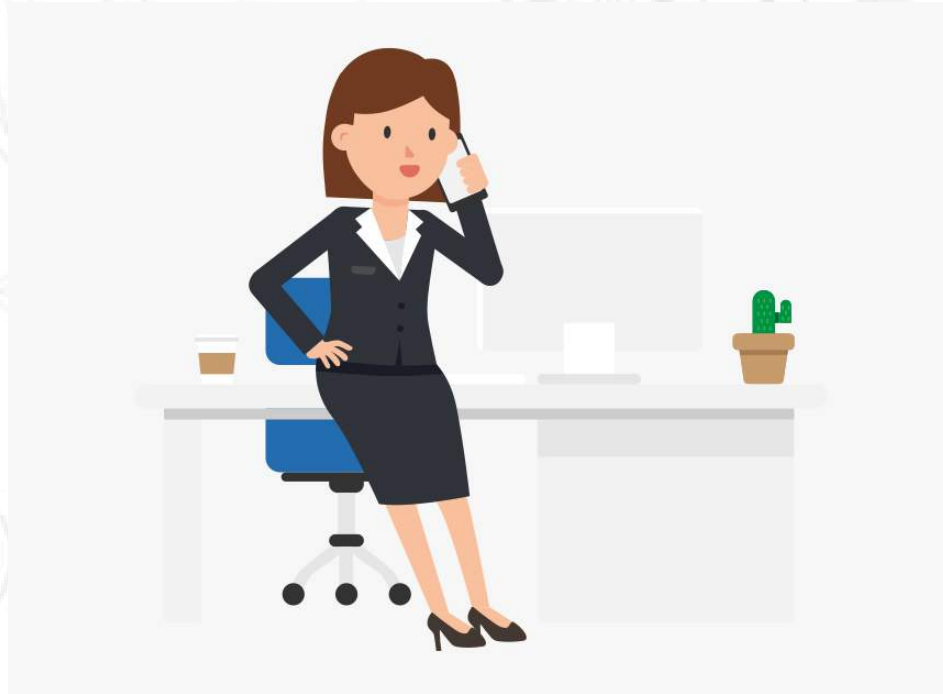
**Indirect: Swearing by Allah/ by Jove/ by
God/ by my life**

EXAMPLE

**Indirect: Swearing by Allah/ by Jove/
by God/ by my life**

**Direct: “By Allah “, she replied, “I will not do
this work.”**

Direct: “By Allah”, she replied, “I will not do this work.”



Indirect: Swearing by Allah, she replied that she would not do that work.

RULE #7

Reported Speech এ Thank you থাকলে,

**Indirect: Reporting Verb এর Subject +
thanked + Reporting Verb এর object.**

EXAMPLE

**Indirect: Reporting Verb এর Subject +
thanked + Reporting Verb এর object.**

Direct: She said to him, "Thank you."

Direct: She said to him, "Thank you."

Indirect: She thanked him.

*Thank
you*



RULE #8

Reported Speech এ Good bye থাকলে,

**Indirect: Reporting Verb এর Subject + bade
+ Reporting Verb এর object + good bye.**

EXAMPLE

**Indirect: Reporting Verb এর Subject + bade
+ Reporting Verb এর object + good bye.**

Direct: She said, "Good bye my buddies."

Direct: She said, "Good bye my buddies."

Indirect: She bade her buddies good bye.





RULE #9

Reported Speech এ good morning/ good evening/ good night থাকলে,

Indirect: Reporting Verb এর Subject + wished + good morning/ good evening/ good night.

EXAMPLE

**Indirect: Reporting Verb अऱ Subject +
wished + good morning/ good
evening/ good night.**

Direct: He said to her, 'Good night'.

Direct: He said to her, "Good night."

Indirect: He wished her good night.

RULE#10

অনেক সময় Reported Speech এ পূর্ণাঙ্গ Sentence না থেকে Sentence এর অংশ অর্থাৎ Phrase থাকলে,

Indirect: বক্তার বক্তব্যকে অনুসরণ করে উক্ত Speech কে পূর্ণাঙ্গ Sentence এ রূপান্তর করতে হয়।

EXAMPLE

Indirect: বক্তার বক্তব্যকে অনুসরণ করে উক্ত Speech কে পূর্ণাঙ্গ Sentence এ রূপান্তর করতে হয়।

Direct: "You've served me a good meal. How much to pay you?" I said to the waiter.


"Four hundred fifty Taka?"

"Four hundred and fifty is alright."

Direct: “You’ve served me a good meal. How much to pay you?” I said to the waiter. “Four hundred and fifty Taka?” “Four hundred and fifty is alright.”

Indirect: I told the waiter that he had served me a good meal. I also asked him how much I should pay him. I further asked him if four hundred fifty taka would do. He replied that four hundred & fifty was all right.





RULE#11

অনেক সময় Direct Speech এ বক্তা ও শ্রোতা উল্লেখ থাকেনা।

**Indirect: সেক্ষেত্রে বক্তার ক্ষেত্রে The speaker এবং
শ্রোতার ক্ষেত্রে The listener অথবা The person
spoken to ব্যবহার করতে হয়।**

EXAMPLE

Indirect: সেক্ষেত্রে বক্তার ক্ষেত্রে The speaker এবং শ্রোতার ক্ষেত্রে The listener অথবা The person spoken to ব্যবহার করতে হয়।

**Direct: "Are you playing tomorrow?"
"Yes, I will play tomorrow afternoon."**

**Direct: "Are you playing tomorrow?"
"Yes, I will play tomorrow afternoon."**

Indirect: The speaker asked the person spoken to if he (L) was playing the next day. The listener replied in the affirmative and said that he would play the next afternoon.
