PRONOUNS VOCABULARY:

Types of Pronouns

Personal pronouns - refers to a specific person or thing.

Example: I, you, he, she, it, we, they

Possessive pronouns - shows ownership or possession.

Example: mine, yours, his, hers, its, ours, theirs

Reflexive pronouns - refers back to the subject of the sentence.

Example: myself, yourself, himself, herself, itself, ourselves, themselves

Demonstrative pronouns - points to a specific person or thing.

Example: this, that, these, those

Interrogative pronouns - used to ask questions.

Example: who, whom, whose, what, which

Indefinite pronouns - refers to a non-specific person or thing.

Example: anyone, everyone, no one, someone, anything, everything, nothing, something

Relative pronouns - connects a dependent clause to a main clause and describes a noun or pronoun.

Example: who, whom, whose, that, which

Types of Pronoun	Pronouns
Personal Pronoun	I, you, he, she, it, we, they
Possessive Pronoun	mine, yours, his, hers, its, ours, theirs
Reflexive Pronoun	myself, yourself, himself, herself, itself, ourselves, yourselves, themselves
Demonstrative Pronoun	this, that, these, those
Interrogative Pronoun	who, whom, whose, what, which
Indefinite Pronoun	anyone, anything, any, each, everybody, everyone, everything, many, nobody, none, nothing, one, other, several, some, somebody, someone, something
Relative Pronoun	who, whom, whose, that, which, where, when, whoever, whomever

Personal Pronouns

- I: I am going to the store.
- You: You are my best friend.
- He: He is the one who broke the vase.
- She: She is a doctor.
- It: It is a nice day outside.
- We: We are going to the beach.
- They: They went to the park without us.

Possessive Pronouns

- Mine: The blue car is mine.
- Yours: Is this book yours?
- His: The car in the garage is his.
- Hers: The black coat is hers.
- Its: The dog is wagging its tail.
- Ours: The blue house is ours.
- Theirs: The yellow car is theirs.

Reflexive Pronouns

- Myself: I made the dress myself.
- Yourself: You should be proud of yourself.
- Himself: He hurt himself while playing soccer.
- Herself: She made the cake herself.
- Itself: The computer fixed itself.
- Ourselves: We did the project ourselves.
- Themselves: They cooked dinner themselves.

Demonstrative Pronouns

- This: This is my favorite song.
- That: That is a really tall building.
- These: These shoes are too small for me.
- Those: Those dogs are barking loudly.

Interrogative Pronouns

- Who: Who is coming with us to the movies?
- Whom: Whom did you give the present to?
- Whose: Whose bag is this?
- What: What is your favorite food?
- Which: Which of these shirts do you like best?

Indefinite Pronouns

- Anyone: Anyone can come to the party.
- Anything: I will do anything to help.
- Any: I don't have any money.
- Each: Each of the students got a prize.
- Everybody: Everybody is going to the concert.
- Everyone: Everyone in the class passed the exam.
- Everything: Everything went according to plan.
- Many: Many people like pizza.
- Nobody: Nobody showed up to the meeting.
- None: None of the dogs are allowed on the couch.
- Nothing: Nothing is better than a good book.
- One: One can never be too prepared.
- Other: The other team won the game.
- Several: Several students were absent today.
- Some: Some of the cake is left.
- Somebody: Somebody left their keys on the table.
- Someone: Someone is knocking on the door.
- Something: Something smells delicious in the kitchen..

Relative Pronouns

- Who: The woman who lives next door is a doctor.
- Whom: The boy whom I saw at the store is my cousin.
- Whose: The man whose car was stolen reported it to the police.
- That: The car that I saw on the street was red.
- Which: The dress which I bought is too small.
- Where: The place where we met is now a coffee shop.
- When: The time when we went to the beach was the best vacation ever.
- Whoever: Whoever wants to join the club is welcome.
- Whomever: You can choose whomever you want to work with.
