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ADJECTIVE VOCABULARY:

- **Descriptive adjectives:** These adjectives describe the physical or sensory qualities of a noun or pronoun, such as size, shape, color, taste, smell, sound, and texture. For example, "big," "red," "sweet," "fragrant," "loud," and "rough" are all descriptive adjectives.
- **Quantitative adjectives:** These adjectives describe the quantity or amount of a noun or pronoun, such as "few," "many," "some," "all," "none," and "several."
- **Demonstrative adjectives:** These adjectives indicate the proximity of a noun or pronoun in space or time, such as "this," "that," "these," and "those."
- **Possessive adjectives:** These adjectives show ownership or possession of a noun or pronoun, such as "my," "your," "his," "her," "its," "our," and "their."
- **Interrogative adjectives:** These adjectives are used to ask questions about a noun or pronoun, such as "what," "which," and "whose."
- **Indefinite adjectives:** These adjectives give a general or vague idea about a noun or pronoun, such as "some," "any," "several," "each," and "every."
- **Comparative adjectives:** These adjectives compare the degree or level of a quality between two nouns or pronouns, such as "taller," "faster," "smarter," and "stronger."
- **Superlative adjectives:** These adjectives compare the degree or level of a quality among three or more nouns or pronouns, such as "tallest," "fastest," "smartest," and "strongest."
- **Distributive Adjectives :** Distributive Adjective হল এমন Adjectives যেগুলো একটা Group এর মধ্যে individual কারো সম্পর্কে কিছু বলে। All Distributive Adjectives: Each, Every, Neither, Any, Both.

● Quantitative adjectives:

Few: Few people attended the concert, so it was not crowded.

Many: Many tourists visit this city every year because of its beautiful landmarks.

Some: Some of the cookies were burnt.

All: All of the participants in the race received a medal.

None: None of the students knew the answer to the difficult question.

Several: Several students volunteered to help with the fundraiser.

Both: Both of the puppies were adopted by loving families.

Neither: Neither of the movies playing at the theater tonight appeal to me.

● Demonstrative adjectives:

This: This shirt is too small for me.

That: That restaurant has the best pizza in town.

These: These shoes are my favorite because they're comfortable and stylish.

Those: Those flowers smell wonderful.

This: This time last year, I was living in a different city.

That: That book on the shelf is a classic.

These: These cookies are delicious; you should try one.

Those: Those clouds in the sky look like they're going to bring rain.

● Possessive adjectives:

My: My cat is sleeping on the couch.

Your: Your phone is ringing; you should answer it.

His: His car is parked in the garage.

Her: Her friends are coming over for dinner tonight.

Its: Its eyes are a beautiful shade of green.

Our: Our house is located near the park.

Their: Their dog is very friendly with strangers.

Your: Your sister is really good at playing the guitar.

● Interrogative adjectives:

What: What time is the meeting?

Which: Which color do you prefer, blue or green?

Whose: Whose car is parked in the driveway?

What: What kind of food do you like?

Which: Which book did you borrow from the library?

● Indefinite adjectives:

Some: Some people like to eat spicy food, while others prefer mild flavors.

Any: Any child can participate in the school's after-school program.

Several: Several guests arrived late to the party.

Each: Each student was given a different assignment to work on.

Every: Every person deserves to be treated with kindness and respect.

● Distributive adjectives:

Each: Each of us got food.

Every: Every customer was happy.

Either: Either phone is a good option.

Neither: Neither of the two boys were hurt.

Both: Both the boys passed the exam.
