Type of Adverb	Examples	Example Sentences
Adverb of Manner	quickly, slowly, carefully, loudly, quietly	She walked quickly to the store. He spoke loudly at the party.
Adverb of Place	here, there, near, far, everywhere	The temperature is under freezing They traveled far to reach the summit.
Adverb of Time	now, soon, yesterday, always, never	I will leave soon to catch my flight. They always eat breakfast together.
Adverb of Frequency	often, rarely, always, sometimes, never	He rarely eats fast food. They often go to the movies on the weekends.
Adverb of Degree	very, extremely, moderately, somewhat, nearly	The water was very cold. She was nearly finished with her book.
Adverb of Affirmation/Negation	certainly, surely, indeed, never, not	He certainly knows how to play the guitar. They did not attend the party.
Interrogative Adverb	how, when, where, why, how often	How often do you go to the gym? When did you arrive at the airport?
Relative Adverb	where, when, why	This is the park where we used to play. Do you remember the day when we met?
Conjunctive Adverb	however, furthermore, therefore, instead, meanwhile	She loves swimming; however, she's afraid of deep water. He wanted to go out; instead, he stayed home.

Adverbs of Place:

here (এখানে)

Come here and sit down next to me.

there (সেখানে)

The store is over there, across the street.

nearby (কাছাকাছি)

There is a good restaurant nearby.

far away (অনেক দূরে)

The nearest gas station is far away from here.

outside (বাইরে)

The children are playing outside in the park.

inside (ভিতরে)

It's cold outside, let's go inside.

upstairs (উপরের তালায়)

He lives upstairs in the apartment building.

downstairs (নিচের তালায়)

The basement is downstairs in the house.

underneath (কোন কিছুর নিচে)

The treasure is buried underneath the tree.

abroad (বিদেশে)

She studied abroad in France for a year.

home (বাসায়)

I can't wait to go home and relax after a long day at work.

everywhere (সব জায়গায়)

The stars shine everywhere in the night sky.

nowhere (কোথাও না)

I am going nowhere.

somewhere (কোথাও)

We will find a solution somewhere along the way.

now (এখন)

then (তখন/ তারপর)

soon (কম সময়ে)

later (পড়ে)

yesterday (গতকাল)

today (আজকে)

tomorrow (কালকে)

before (আগে)

after (পড়ে)

already (ইতিমধ্যে)

never (কখনো না)

always (সব সময়)

frequently (প্রায়ই)

occasionally (মাঝে মাঝে)

rarely (খুব কমই)

sometimes (কখনও কখনও)

often (প্রায়ই)

lately (এই আজকাল)

recently (সম্প্রতি /এই কিছুদিন আগে)

I need to leave now to catch my train.

He was happy then, but now he's sad.

We will go on vacation soon.

I will call you later when I'm finished with work.

Yesterday was a beautiful day.

Today is Tuesday, and tomorrow is Wednesday.

I have a meeting tomorrow morning.

Before you go to bed, brush your teeth.

After the concert, we went out for dinner.

She has already finished her homework.

He never goes to bed before midnight.

They always eat breakfast together on the weekends.

She frequently visits her grandparents in the countryside.

I check my email daily.

weekly (প্রতি সপ্তাহে)

She goes to yoga class weekly.

monthly (প্রতি মাসে)

They have a monthly meeting at work.

yearly (প্রতি বছরে)

They celebrate their anniversary yearly.

hourly (প্রতি ঘণ্টায়)

The clock chimes hourly.

constantly (সব সময়)

He is constantly checking his phone.

intermittently (বিরতি নিয়ে নিয়ে)

The electricity is going out intermittently.

Adverbs of Degree:

very (অনেক)

extremely (অনেক বেশি)

moderately (মোটামটি)

somewhat (কিছুটা)

nearly (প্রায়)

hardly (খুব কমই)

fully (পুরোপুরি ভাবে)

partly (কিছু অংশ)

almost (প্রায়)

completely (সম্পূর্ণ ভাবে)

totally (পুরোপুরি ভাবে)

utterly (একদম)

just (এই একটুর জন্য/ এই এখনি)

simply (শুধু মাত্র)

quite (বেশ)

too (একটু বেশি)

enough (যথেষ্ট)

She was moderately successful in her career.

The movie was somewhat entertaining.

She was nearly finished with her book.

Adverbs of Affirmation:

certainly (অবশ্যই)	She certainly knows how to play the piano.
indeed (আসলেই)	The movie was indeed very good.
absolutely (একদম)	He absolutely loves chocolate.
definitely (অবশ্যই)	She will definitely be at the party.
naturally (স্বাভাবিকভাবে)	It's naturally dark outside at night.
positively (ইতিবাচকভাবে)	She positively knows the answer.

Adverbs of Negation:

not (কোন কিছু না)	She is not happy with the situation.
no (নয়)	No, I haven't seen that movie yet.
never (কখনই না)	He never goes to bed before midnight.
hardly (খুব কমই)	He hardly ever goes out on weekends.
scarcely (খুব কমই)	The town was scarcely populated.
barely (সবে)	The student barely passed the test.
rarely (খুব কমই)	She rarely eats fast food.

Interrogative Adverbs:

where (কোথায়)

Where did you go last night?

when (কখন)

When will the package arrive?

how (কিভাবে)

How did you solve the problem?

why (কেন)

Why did you leave the party early?

how much (কত/ কত টুক)

How much does the dress cost?

how often (কত প্রায় প্রায়)

How often do you exercise?

how long (কতখন ব্যাপী)

How long does the concert last?

in what way (কোন উপায়ে)

In what way can we improve our customer service?

accordingly (সেই অনুযায়ী)

furthermore (তার উপর)

however (টা হলেও / কিন্তু)

indeed (আসলেই)

moreover (তার উপর)

nevertheless (টা হলেও)

otherwise (তা না হলে)

similarly (তেমনই)

therefore (তাই)

instead (পরিবর্তে)

He studied hard and accordingly, he earned a good grade on the exam.

She not only studied the book but furthermore, she studied from the internet too.

He loves playing football, however, he also enjoys playing basketball.

It was indeed a beautiful day at the beach.

He not only likes to read, moreover, he enjoys writing poetry.

She was nervous about giving the presentation, nevertheless, she did a great job.

He needs to leave now, otherwise, he will miss his flight.

He enjoys hiking, and similarly, he loves to go camping in the mountains.

He ate a lot of junk food, and therefore, he gained weight.
