## Simple/ Complex/ Compound

গঠনানুসারে Sentence তিন প্রকার । যথা:

(1) **Simple sentence** (সরল বাক্য): Simple sentence -এ একটি মাত্র finite verb ও একটি মাত্র subject থাকে যেমন :He is a good boy.

(2) **Compound sentence** (মিশ্র/যৌগিক বাক্য): দুটি Simple sentence সাধারণত Conjunction যেমন and/but/or দ্বারা যুক্ত থাকে । দুটি finite verb অবশ্যই থাকবে । and/but এর পর একই subject দুই বার ব্যবহার না করলেও চলে ।\* and/but দ্বারা দুটি word কে যোগ করলে হবেনা [He is poor but happy(Simple)] , দুটি Simple sentence কে যোগ করতে হবে[He is poor but is happy(Compound)] ।

(3) **Complex sentence** (জটিল বাক্য): Complex sentence-এ একাধিক Simple sentence যে কোন clause যেমন: Since, when, as, though, although, after, before, that, how দ্বারা যুক্ত থাকবে ।যেমন: If you come here, I shall accompany you.

### 1. Structure :

**Simple :** V-ing phrase + ` , ' + sub + verb + Related word (২য় অংশ)

**Compound :** Sub + verb + V-ing ( এর বাকী অংশ ) + and + sentence এর ২য় অংশ

**Complex :** Since/As/When + sub + সংশিষ্ট শব্দ + ` , ' + পুনঃsub + verb + সংশিষ্ট শব্দ (Related word )

Example :

(a) Simple : Seeing the police , the thief ran away.

Compound : The thief saw the police and he ran away.

Complex : When the thief saw the police , he ran away.

(b) Simple : Closing the door , I went back to work.

Compound : I closed the door and I went back to work.

Complex : When I closed the door , I went back to work.

(c) Simple : Forgetting him , I went out.

Compound : I had forgotten and I went out.

Complex : As I had forgotten him , I went out.

(d) Simple : Killing the bird , the old man brought bad luck to the crew.

Compound : The old man killed the bird and he brought bad luck to the crew.

Complex : Since the old man killed the bird , he brought bad luck to the crew.

(e) Simple : Forgetting him , I went out.

Compound : I had forgotten him and I went out.

Complex : As I had forgotten him , I went out.

**Nota Bene(N.B)** ( বিশেষ দ্রষ্টব্য ) : **Complex sentence** এর প্রথম clause টিতে **am / is / are / was / were** থাকলে এদের পরিবর্তে **being** এবং **have / has / had** থাকলে **having** বসিয়ে simple করতে হয় sentence এর আর কোন পরিবর্তন হয় না । যথা :-

(f) Simple : The meeting being over , we went back home.

Compound : The meeting was over and we went back home .

Complex : When the meeting was over , we went back home .

(g) Simple : The weather being very cold , there were no birds or animals in the snow covered country .

Compound : The weather was very cold and there were no birds or animals in the snow covered country.

Complex : Since the weather was very cold , there were no birds or animals in the snow covered country .

(h) Simple : Having finished my lessons , I went to bed .

Compound : I had finished my lessons and I went to bed .

Complex : When I had finished my lessons , I went to bed .

## 2. Structure :

**Simple : Because of + poss. adj. + Noun + ` , ” + 2<sup>nd</sup> clause**

**Compound : Sub + Verb + সংশ্লিষ্ট শব্দ + ` , " + 2<sup>nd</sup> clause**

**Complex : Since / As + Sub + Verb + সংশ্লিষ্ট শব্দ + ` , " + 2<sup>nd</sup> clause**

**Example :**

(a) Simple : Because of my illness , I could not attend the school .

Compound : I was ill and so , I could not attend the school .

Complex : Since I was ill , I could not attend the school .

(b) Simple : Because of his being weak , the old man could not attend the court .

Compound : The old man was weak and so , he could not attend the court .

Complex : Since The old man was weak , he could not attend the court .

(c) Simple : Because of his having integrity, Salim was loved by all.

Compound : Salim had integrity and so, he was loved by all.

Complex : As Salim had integrity, he was loved by all.

(d) Simple : Because of his very small size, he could not work hard.

Compound : He was small and so, he could not work hard .

Complex : Since he was small, he could not work hard.

**N.B: Am/is/are থাকলে simple sentence-এ being এবং have/has/had থাকলে havingবসে.**

**3. Structure :**

**Simple : In spite of + sub. poss. form + verb + ing/being/having + সংশ্লিষ্ট শব্দ  
+ ২য় অংশ**

**Compound : Sub + verb + সংশ্লিষ্ট শব্দ + but + ২য় অংশ**

**Complex : Although + sub + সংশ্লিষ্ট শব্দ + ২য় অংশ**

**Example :**

(a) Simple : In spite of his trying heart and soul , he could not succeed.

Compound : He tried heart and soul but he could not succeed.

Complex : Although he tried heart and soul , he could not succeed.

(b) Simple : In spite of his being poor, he is honest.

Compound : He is poor but he is honest.

Complex : Although he is poor , he is honest.

(c) Simple : In spite of his having vast riches, the man wants more.

Compound : The man has vast riches but he wants more.

Complex : Although the man has vast riches, he wants more.

(d) Simple : In spite of his working hard, could not succeed.

Compound : He worked hard but he could not succeed.

Complex : Although he worked hard, he could not succeed.

(e) Simple : In spite of his running fast, he could not get the train .

Compound : He run fast but he could not get the train.

Complex : Though he run fast, he could not get the train.

#### 4. Structure :

**Simple : Sub + too + adj./adv. + to+ verb + সংশিষ্ট শব্দ**

**Compound : Sub + very /extremely + adj./adv. + and so+ sub+ can't /couldn't + মূলverb + সংশিষ্ট শব্দ**

**Complex : Sub + verb + so+ adj./adv. + can't /couldn't + verb + সংশিষ্ট শব্দ**

(a) Simple : He is too poor to buy a car .

Compound : He is very poor and so, he can't buy a car .

Complex : He is so poor that he can't buy a car .

(b) Simple : The man is too weak to walk.

Compound : The man is very weak and so, he can't walk.

Complex : The man is so weak that he can't walk.

(c) Simple : The problem was too hard for them to solve.

Compound : The problem was extremely hard and so,  
they couldn't solve it.

Complex : The problem was so hard for them that they couldn't solve it.

#### 5. Structure :

**Compound :R.W (adj./adv.) or+ sub +Auxi.V + not + মূল verb + সংশিষ্ট শব্দ**

**Complex : If + sub +do not+ মূল verb + সংশিষ্ট শব্দ+ , ' + 2<sup>nd</sup> clause .**

#### Example :

(a) Simple : Without working hard , you will not prosper in life .

Compound : Work hard or you will not prosper in life .

Complex : If you do not work hard , you will not prosper in life .

(b) Simple : Without reading attentively , you will not pass the exam .

Compound : Read attentively or you will not pass the exam .

Complex : If you do not read attentively , you will not pass the exam .

(c) Simple : Without moving , you will die .

Compound : Move or you will die .

Complex : If you do not move , you will die .

(d) Simple : Without playing well , you will not win the game .  
Compound : Play well or you will not win the game .  
Complex : If you do not play well , you will not win the game .

(e) Simple : Without writing much , you can not write well .  
Compound : Write much or you can not write well .  
Complex : If you do not write much , you can not write well .

#### 6. Structure :

**Simple :** By + v.+ ing + *সংশ্লিষ্ট শব্দ* + ` , ` +2<sup>nd</sup> clause .

**Compound :** *মূল verb* + *সংশ্লিষ্ট শব্দ* + and +2<sup>nd</sup> clause .

**Complex :** If + sub + *সংশ্লিষ্ট শব্দ* + +2<sup>nd</sup> clause .

#### Example :

(a) Simple : By eating balanced diet, you can keep a sound body.

Compound : Eat balanced diet and you can keep a sound body.

Complex : If you eat balanced diet, you can keep a sound body.

(b) Simple : By working hard , you will shine in life.

Compound : Work hard and you will shine in life.

Complex : If you work hard, you will shine in life.

(c) Simple : By running fast , you can win the prize.

Compound : Run fast and you can win the prize.

Complex : If you run fast, you can win the prize.

#### 7. Structure :

**Simple :** N.P.( Noun / Pronoun )+ being/having + *সংশ্লিষ্ট শব্দ* + , + 2<sup>nd</sup> clause .

**Compound :** N.P.+ be / have verb + *সংশ্লিষ্ট শব্দ* + and so + 2<sup>nd</sup> clause .

**Complex :** When/Since + sub + be/have verb+ *সংশ্লিষ্ট শব্দ* + , +and so + 2<sup>nd</sup> clause .

#### Example :

(a) Simple : The sea water being very salty, they could not drink it .

Compound : The sea water was very salty and so , they could not drink it .

Complex : Since the sea water was very salty, they could not drink it .

(b) Simple : The sun having set , we returned home .

Compound : The sun had set and we returned home .

Complex : When the sun had set , we returned home .

#### 8. Structure :

**Simple :** NP + verb + .....+ to + verb + *সংশ্লিষ্ট শব্দ*

**Compound :** NP + want to + verb + ....+ and so , + NP + verb + *সংশ্লিষ্ট শব্দ*

**Complex :** NP + verb + .....+ so that + NP + can / could / may / might + verb + *সংশ্লিষ্ট শব্দ*

(a) Simple : I went there to see him .

Compound : I wanted to see him and so , I went there .

Complex : I went there so that I might see him .

(b) Simple : The authoress wanted quite isolation to do some troublesome writings.

Compound : The authoress wanted to do some troublesome writings and so , he wanted quite isolation.

Complex : The authoress wanted quite isolation so that he could do some troublesome writings.

### 9. Structure :

**Simple :** NP + v – ing + *সংশ্লিষ্ট শব্দ* +.....

OR

**NP + Verb + *সংশ্লিষ্ট শব্দ* + V-ing + .....**

**Compound :** NP + Verb + *সংশ্লিষ্ট শব্দ* + and + sub + verb +.....

**Complex :** NP + Verb + *সংশ্লিষ্ট শব্দ* + who / which / that + verb + .....

#### Example :

( a ) Simple : The writer lived in a cabin belonging to the orphanage .

Compound : The writer lived in a cabin and it belonged to the orphanage .

Complex : The writer lived in a cabin that belonged to the orphanage .

( b ) Simple : I saw a bird flying in the sky.

Compound : I saw a bird and it was flying in the sky.

Complex : I saw a bird that was flying in the sky.

### 10. Structure :

**Simple :** On + v-ing + *সংশ্লিষ্ট শব্দ* + sub + verb + *সংশ্লিষ্ট শব্দ*

**Compound :** Sub + verb + *সংশ্লিষ্ট শব্দ* + and , at once + sub + verb + *সংশ্লিষ্ট শব্দ*

**Complex :** As soon as + sub + verb + *সংশ্লিষ্ট শব্দ* + , + sub + verb + *সংশ্লিষ্ট শব্দ*

#### Example :

(a) Simple : On seeing the fob chair , Della seemed it to be Jeem`s.

Compound : Della saw the fob chair ,at once , she seemed it to be Jeem`s .

Complex : As soon as Della saw the fob chair , she seemed it to be Jeem`s .

(b) Simple : On returning home , Karim went to play in the field .

Compound : Karim returned home and , at once , he went to play in the field .

Complex : As soon as Karim returned home , he went to play in the field .`OR`

No sooner had Karim returned home , he went to play in the field .

(c) Simple : At the time of the teacher`s entering into the classroom , the students stood up .

Compound : The teacher entered into the classroom and , at once , the students stood up .

Complex : As soon as the teacher entered into the classroom , the students stood up .

(d) Simple : At the time of my reaching the school , the bell rang .  
Compound : I reached the school , and at once the bell rang .  
Complex : As soon as I reached the school , the bell rang .

#### 11. Structure :

**Simple : At the time of + poss.adj + v-ing + सर्वशिष्ट शब्द + ` , ' + full sentence**

**Compound : Sub + verb + सर्वशिष्ट शब्द + and , at that time + full sentence**

**Complex : When + sub + verb + सर्वशिष्ट शब्द + ` , ' + principal clause**

**Example :**

(a) Simple : At the time of his coming here , it had been raining .  
Compound : He came here and , at that time , it had been raining .  
Complex : When he came here and , at that time , it had been raining .

(b) Simple : At the time of my reading , he came here .  
Compound : I was reading and , at that time , he came here .  
Complex : When I was reading , he came here .

(c) Simple : At the time of their playing , it began to rain .  
Compound : They were playing and , at that time , it began to rain .  
Complex : When they were playing it began to rain .

(d) Simple : At the age of four , he left the village .  
Compound : He was four , and at that time , he left the village .  
Complex : When he was four , he left the village .

**Complex : Sub + verb + noun + Related pronoun + be verb + Adj.টি**

**Example :-**

Simple: I saw a lame man .  
Compound : I saw a man and he was lame.

Complex : I saw a man who was lame.

If the one-syllable adjective ends with an e, just add **-r** for the comparative form and **-st** for the superlative form.
